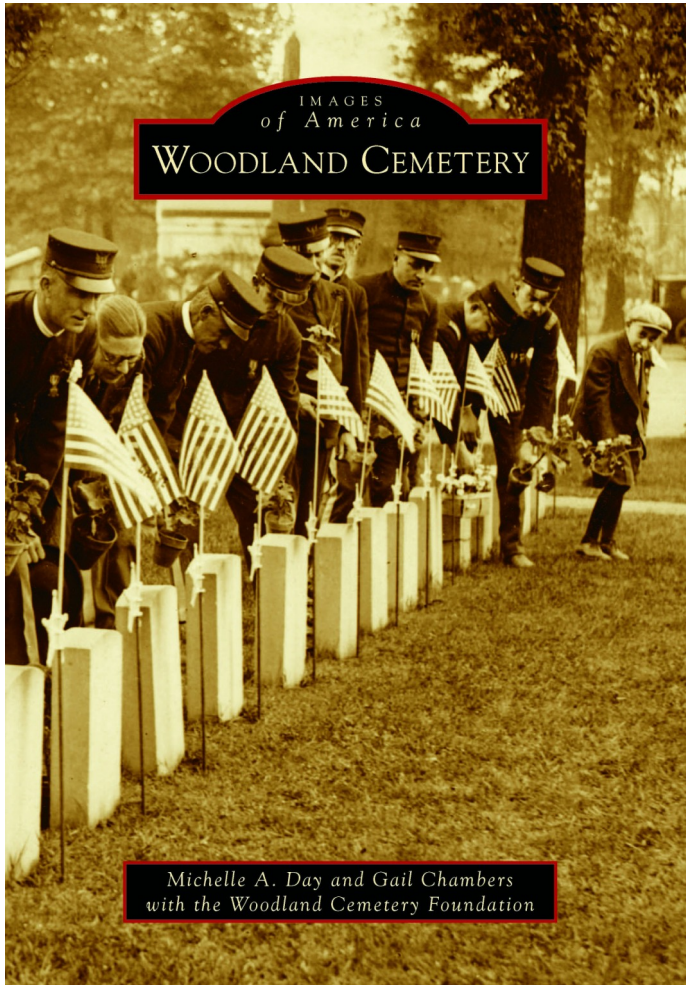


Images of America: Woodland Cemetery

Woodland Cemetery, Cleveland's second oldest cemetery, was named after a romantic description of an unseen Cleveland, part of a popular 1803 pastoral poem, "Pleasures of Hope," by Scottish poet, Thomas Campbell. Its sixty level acres provide a primer on American cemetery design, from the "rural cemetery" intricacies of the 1850s through a more rambling style of the late 19th century to the rectangular 20th century grid. Its mausoleums are in classical, Victorian, Egyptian, and Richardson rustic designs. These varied structures, along with angels, obelisks, and military memorials are symbolic of the residents resting within the gates.
